EPISTLE READING

HEBREWS 2:1–13

¹Therefore we must pay much closer attention to what we have heard, lest we drift away from it. ²For since the message declared by angels proved to be reliable and every transgression or disobedience received a just retribution, ³how shall we escape if we neglect such a great salvation? It was declared at first by the Lord, and it was attested to us by those who heard, ⁴while God also bore witness by signs and wonders and various miracles and by gifts of the Holy Spirit distributed according to his will.

⁵Now it was not to angels that God subjected the world to come, of which we are speaking. ⁶It has been testified somewhere,

“What is man, that you are mindful of him, or the son of man, that you care for him?

⁷You made him for a little while lower than the angels;
you have crowned him with glory and honor,

⁸putting everything in subjection under his feet.”

Now in putting everything in subjection to him, he left nothing outside his control. At present, we do not yet see everything in subjection to him. ⁹But we see him who for a little while was made lower than the angels, namely Jesus, crowned with glory and honor because of the suffering of death, so that by the grace of God he might taste death for everyone.

That is why he is not ashamed to call them brothers, ¹²saying,

“I will tell of your name to my brothers; in the midst of the congregation I will sing your praise.” ¹³And again, “I will put my trust in him.”

But for those who are not listening, even what little understanding they have will be taken away from them.” (Mark 4 New Living Trans)

³³ Jesus used many similar stories and illustrations to teach the people as much as they could understand. ³⁴ In fact, in his public ministry he never taught without using parables; but afterward, when he was alone with his disciples, he explained everything to them. (Mark 4 NLT)

⁹ “But watch out! Be careful never to forget what you yourself have seen. Do not let these memories escape from your mind as long as you live! And be sure to pass them on to your children and grandchildren. (Deuteronomy 4, NLT)

Pastor Call Committee Update

After meeting for prayer and discussion, the Call Committee was led by God's Spirit to recommend that we review the list of pastoral candidates given to us (by congregation nominations and District President recommendation/endorsement) to bring at least two names to our next Voters Meeting/Call Service.

The Florida-Georgia District President recommends that Call Services to elect a Pastor, in the Voters Meeting setting, typically include at least two candidates, in order to allow members the opportunity to pray for and discuss whom they believe God is calling to their ministry. Our Call Committee believes, and therefore recommends to our Board of Directors and to the Voters Assembly, that they prepare a slate of pastoral candidates with at least two names of pastors who have indicated in the past they are open to giving "serious consideration" to our Call. The Call Committee believes it can and will complete this task relatively quickly. Immediately then, the Circuit Visitor (Pastor Jeff Jordan of Rivercliff LC) will contact the additional potential candidates to see if, in their current circumstances, they are open to considering a Call. When the Circuit Visitor completes his work, the Call Committee will request, through our Board of Directors, a Voters Meeting/Call Service. The Call Committee will publish and make available to you, our members, the relevant candidate information. Karen Cerny continues to serve most capably as Call Committee Chair. She's joined by Russ Couch, Elders Vinny Caracci and Tim Lambert, Peter Amelingmeier, Liz Cain, and Joshua Hildebrandt. Pastor Ken and Principal Amy Kurtz serve as an advisory members.

Lutheran Heritage Foundation (LHF) Sunday, October 20, 2024

Imagine trying to understand Scripture in all its richness without the benefit of Luther's Small Catechism, or trying to teach young children about basic Bible stories without books like A Child's Garden of Bible Stories. For Lutheran churches around the world, these situations are reality. They don't have the basic books, so vital to understanding the Lutheran faith, because no one has translated them into their languages. Guest Preacher Rev. Mark Moss shares the story of LHF.
