THIS WEEK AT FAITH

Making an impact at home and abroad! As Lutheran Women in Mission, we know it's an honor to serve God by serving others. We serve local organizations with Gifts from the Heart, Mission Service Activities, and Special Offerings. And through a careful selection process, we choose mission grant recipients from around the world each biennium. Starting with one grant of \$15,000 our mission grant goal continues to grow each biennium. In 2023, a Mission Goal of \$2,350,000 was approved to fund 31 grants. The seed of the mustard plant is among the smallest of seeds, yet from this small seed grows a large bush. Jesus used the analogy of a mustard seed to show how something small and seemingly insignificant can have a powerful impact. Like the analogy, our Mustard Seed Daily Devotions are short devotions, small seeds of faith, that are great for your spiritual growth, and are easy to sow by sharing with friends.

Pastor Call Committee Update

After meeting for prayer and discussion, the Call Committee was led by God's Spirit to recommend that we review the list of pastoral candidates given to us (by congregation nominations and District President recommendation/endorsement) to bring at least two names to our next Voters Meeting/Call Service.

The Florida-Georgia District President recommends that Call Services to elect a Pastor, in the Voters Meeting setting, typically include at least two candidates, in order to allow members the opportunity to pray for and discuss whom they believe God is calling to their ministry. Our Call Committee believes, and therefore recommends to our Board of Directors and to the Voters Assembly, that they prepare a slate of pastoral candidates with at least two names of pastors who have indicated in the past they are open to giving "serious consideration" to our Call.

The Call Committee believes it can and will complete this task relatively quickly. Immediately then, the Circuit Visitor (Pastor Jeff Jordan of Rivercliff LC) will contact the additional potential candidates to see if, in their current circumstances, they are open to considering a Call. When the Circuit Visitor completes his work, the Call Committee will request, through our Board of Directors, a Voters Meeting/Call Service. The Call Committee will publish and make available to you, our members, the relevant candidate information.

From the Florida-Georgia District

Dear Friends, As Hurricane Milton bears down on Fort Myers, FL — where we continue long-term recovery operations for survivors of Hurricane Ian — our Disaster Relief teams are closely monitoring the situation and preparing to respond. Due to the severity of the storm, which has now strengthened to a Category 5, our teams have safely evacuated our bases in Valdosta, GA, and Fort Myers. They have temporarily relocated to Columbus, GA, where they will remain until conditions are safe to resume operations.

In addition to our preparations for Hurricane Milton, we are still responding to Hurricane Helene. We will be opening a new base of operations in Augusta, GA, on Friday, October 11, with work scheduled to begin on Saturday, October 12. We are in desperate need of volunteers, especially Team Leaders, to join us in this critical work. If Hurricane Milton causes significant damage to Fort Myers areas, our volunteer teams will be mobilized for local cleanup efforts as soon as it is safe.

Our teams are awaiting confirmation to establish a base in East Tennessee, near the North Carolina and Virginia state lines, to maximize our impact and assist more families and individuals affected by Hurricane Helene in Mountain City and surrounding areas. If activated, we will urgently need volunteers to support these efforts.

Our office along with LCMS has set up 3 Camps (Tampa, Valdosta and Augusta). Unfortunately, we are only setting these up for a month due to how short we are in LERT volunteers. PLEASE share with your congregations, circuits and others the opportunity to volunteer, even if it's just for a couple days. The two GA locations are mostly "chain saw" trained people, but St Pete/Tampa is tear out of drywall – anyone can do this.
