What is Confirmation?

Confirmation is a public rite of the church preceded by a period of instruction designed in which baptized Christians learn about the confession, life, and mission of the Christian Church. Prior to admission to the Lord's Supper, it is necessary to be instructed in the Christian faith (1 Corinthians 11:28). The rite of confirmation provides an opportunity for the individual Christian, relying on God's promises given in Holy Baptism, to make a personal public confession of the faith and a lifelong pledge of fidelity to Christ.

Truly, truly, I say to you, you will weep and lament, but the world will rejoice. You will be sorrowful, but your sorrow will turn into joy. When a woman is giving birth, she has sorrow because her hour has come, but when she has delivered the baby, she no longer remembers the anguish, for joy that a human being has been born into the world. So also you have sorrow now, but I will see you again and your hearts will rejoice, and no one will take your joy from you."

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Do you this day in the presence of God and of this congregation acknowledge the gifts that God gave you in your Baptism? Yes, I do.

Do you renounce the devil and all his works and ways? Yes, I renounce them.

Do you believe in God the Father Almighty?

Yes, I believe in God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord?

Yes, I believe in Jesus Christ, His only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died and was buried. We rejoice with thankful hearts that you have been baptized and have received the teaching of the Lord. You have confessed the faith and have been welcomed into membership at Faith. As you continue in your baptismal calling and grace, He who has begun a good work in you will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ. **Amen.**
