Sometimes we are tempted to question God, asking why He would let bad things happen to us or others. **According to Job 38:4 (quoted in CFM, 151), why is it fruitless to question God in this way?** _____

Both accounts in this passage involve people who are suffering. The disciples are suffering due to their fear of the storm. The possessed men are suffering under the oppression of the demons.

According to Romans 8:18-23, what is the cause of this and all other suffering? _____

Think again about Jesus asleep in the boat. **Why was Jesus unfazed by the "threats" He faced in this world?** _____

How should we respond when we face suffering in this life? (see Romans 8:31-32) _____
