(Mark 5:21-24, 35-43; Luke 7:11-17, pp. 155-161)

The topic of death is everywhere in our life and in the Scripture.

“As far as our eyes can see, death holds sway over all humanity. But Jesus Christ came into our world to win His victory over death.” (CFM, 156)

Both Jairus’ daughter and the young man are raised with a Word.

Notice the similarity of the Words:

“Little girl, I say to you, arise.” (Mark 5:41)

“Young man, I say to you, arise.” (Luke 7:14)
