WEEK 22 – THE DEATH OF JOHN THE BAPTIST (Mark 6:14-29, pp. 171-177)

This week's readings focus on the death of John the Baptist at the hands of Herod Antipas. Herod's execution of John seems to indicate a turning point in his relationship with God's Word and the temptations he faced in his life.

Herod's response to John is mixed. He is interested in what John has to say, and perhaps even convicted by it; but he is not willing to admit his sins or turn away from them.

¹⁶ *And these are the ones sown on rocky ground: the ones who, when they hear the word, immediately receive it with joy. ¹⁷ And they have no root in themselves, but endure for a while; then, when tribulation or persecution arises on account of the word, immediately they fall away. (Mark 4:16-17 ESV)*

The word "tribulation" often evokes ideas of disaster or persecution that threatens our lives. But for Herod, "**tribulation arises in the form of a dinner party, where Herod must decide between saving John or saving face in front of his guests.**" (CFM, p. 175)
