## **Week 1 – IN THE BEGINNING** (John 1:1-18, pp. 3-9)

John 1 takes us back to the beginning. How do the Words in this passage connect directly to the first chapter of Genesis 1? (*Read Gen. 1:1-3*)

What John is saying about Jesus' identity is so profound and important. The significance of the cross, which is the center and focus of our lives, our worship, and our faith depends directly on the identity of the one who hangs on it.
